Dr. Kornely Kakachia

Kornely Kakachia is a Director of Tbilisi based think tank Georgian Institute of Politics and a Professor of Political Science at Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University, Georgia. His current research focuses on Georgian domestic and foreign policy, security issues of the wider Black Sea area and comparative party politics. He was a recipient of IREX and OSI fellowships and was a visiting fellow at Harvard University's Black Sea Security program, (2009–2010) Harriman Institute, Columbia University (2011) and The Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies. In his capacity as an expert on Georgian Domestic and Foreign policy, Kakachia has appeared on BBC, Deutsche Welle, Financial Times, Le Monde, Figaro, VOA, as well as on Georgian radio and television stations to comment on Georgia's foreign policy, regional security and other issues.

H.E. Petr Mikyska

H.E. Petr Mikyska is an Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Czech Republic to Georgia. Ambassador Mikyska was born in 1966, in Městec Králové, Czechia. He graduated from Moscow State Institute of International Relations, Faculty of International Journalism, Charles University in Prague and Diplomatic Academy of Santiago de Chile. During his carreer he occupied several posts in Czech Embassies in Latin America, namely Commercial Attaché in Peru, Deputy Head of Mission and Head of Political Section in Mexico and Head of Mission – Chargé d'affaires in Cuba. Mr. Mikyska also established Czech Consulate General in Toronto, which he led for almost two years. Between 2010 and 2012 he headed the Territorial Agendas and Macroeconomic Analysis Working Group of the Department of Bilateral Economic Relations and Trade Promotion at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic in Prague. At 2012 he opened the Embassy of the Czech Republic in Yerevan, Armenia, where he served as Chargé d'affaires, and since 2015 till 2019 as Ambassador.On July 3, 2019, Mr. Mikyska presented to the President of Georgia, Ms Salome Zourabichvili, Letters of Credence accrediting him as Ambassador of the Czech Republic to Georgia.

Renata Skardziute-Kereselidze

Renata Skardžiūtė-Kereselidze is deputy director at Georgian Institute of Politics, where she worked since 2012. She is alumna of the On Think Tanks Fellowship Program "Integral Leaders for Global Challenges" (2017). Before joining GIP Renata has worked as a journalist covering foreign policy and European issues in Lithuania, and was recipient of Heinrich Boell fellowship to research EU strategies in conflict resolution in Georgia. Her interests include collective identities, European integration and Eastern Partnership. She earned her MA at Central European University (CEU), Nationalism Studies department (2009); and received BA in Political Science, Institute of International Relations and Political Science (IIRPS), Vilnius University (2008).

Ekaterine Basilaia teaches at the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication at Tbilisi State University.

Filip Pazderski - A lawyer and sociologist after studies at University of Warsaw, he has also graduated from European Master's Degree Program in Human Rights and Democratization (E.MA) in Venice. Currently he is finishing his doctoral thesis at the Institute of Philosophy and Sociology of the Polish Academy of Sciences. Senior Policy Analyst and Project Manager in the Civil Society and Democracy Program of the Institute of Public Affairs in Poland (a non-partisan think-tank organization established in 1995), where he works on civil society, civic education, public participation, democratic institutions and social enterprises development, being an author of numerous researches, expert opinions and publications on these subjects. Co-author of the Long-term policy on volunteering development in Poland prepared within Polish Ministry of Labour and Social Policy. Since 2016 he is responsible for preparation of USAID's CSOs Sustainability Index report for Poland. He conducted research and wrote reports for such organizations and institutions as the Open Society European Policy Institute (OSEPI), the National Democratic Institute (NDI), the Office of the Senate of the Republic of Poland, Polish Ministry of Labour and Social Policy. Since 2003 he is active in civil society building, as well as promotion of human rights and democratic standards while cooperating with several different NGOs in Poland and abroad. Vice-president of the European Civic Forum, a network of more than 100 organisations working on the civic related issues. He is also one of the co-founders and since 2009 a president of the Association for the Podlasie Land DRUMLA (based in Poland).

Since October 2018, Mr. Kakhishvili is a DAAD scholar pursuing his doctoral research on political party competition in post-Soviet hybrid regimes. His field of expertise includes democratization, political parties, Georgia's foreign policy with a focus on Georgian-Russian relations, and issues related to national identity, ethnic minorities and nationalism. Mr. Kakhishvili has obtained two Master's degrees: MSc in Russian and East European Studies from the University of Oxford, St Antony's College and MSocSc in Transformation in South Caucasus from Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University.
